

	Required By Camp	Renewal
<b>Spay or Neuter</b>	<b>X</b>	<b>Required by Camp once camper is ONE year of age.</b>
IF any dog, male or female, shows signs of aggression, behavioral issues, or over stimulation prior to spay/neuter, then they will be required to be altered earlier than 12 months to remain at Camp. Special considerations due to health concerns will be handled on an individual basis, no dog will be allowed to socialize if problems arise.		
<b>Annual Exam</b>	<b>X</b>	<b>Yearly</b>
<u>Heartworm Exam</u>	<b>X</b>	<b>Yearly</b>
<b>Vaccines</b> - Each Member's veterinarians can choose the protocol for individual or combo vaccines as long as all are covered. Annual, every other, or every 3 years are accepted if dog is over 24 months and healthy.		
<b>CORE Vaccines</b>		
<u>Rabies</u> (Required by law.)	<b>X</b>	<b>One year after the first vaccine and every three years thereafter.</b>
<u>Distemper</u>	<b>X</b>	<b>One year after the first vaccine and every three years thereafter.</b>
<u>Adenovirus 1/2</u>	<b>X</b>	
<u>Para-influenza</u>	<b>X</b>	
<u>Parvovirus</u>	<b>X</b>	
Combo vaccines are usually listed as DHPP (Distemper + Hepatitis [Adenovirus 1 & 2] + Para-Influenza + Parvovirus), or DHLPP (Distemper + Hepatitis [Adenovirus 1 and 2] + Leptospira + Para-Influenza + Parvovirus), or DA2PP (Distemper + Adenovirus 1 & 2 + Para-Influenza + Parvovirus). Other variations may occur.		
<b>Non-CORE Vaccines</b>		
<u>Coronavirus</u>		<b>Vet Discretion, Not recommended by AAHA.</b>
<u>Leptospira</u>		<b>Vet Discretion, if recommended, boosted yearly.</b>
<u>Bordetella</u>	<b>X</b>	<b>Suggested every six to twelve months.</b>
<b>Titers</b>		
Vaccine Titers are welcome and accepted as long as all of our requirements are covered and results are provided for our files and review. Titers can reduce the need for recurring vaccines, as long as the dog is healthy and maintaining the vaccine.		
<b>Preventatives</b>		
Heartworm	<b>X</b>	<b>Monthly (Some products may differ.)</b>
Flea & Tick	<b>X</b>	<b>Monthly (Some products may differ.) Campers are not allowed to wear flea collars while attending Camp.</b>
Deworming	<b>X</b>	<b>Suggested every six months. Required by Camp every three months, see below*.</b>
*Deworming Requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ALL new members' campers will have a deworming with an approved drug before the evaluation.</li> <li>• Active members must have intestinal parasites controlled with Camp approved preventatives.</li> <li>• Camp requires Drontal or Panacur dewormer quarterly if not on an approved heartworm preventative.</li> <li>• Approved heartworm preventatives: Interceptor, Sentinel, Trifexis, Combo-gard, or Advantage Multi.</li> </ul>		
<b>Testing/Diagnostics</b> ANY POSITIVE RESULTS in the following must be provided to Camp ASAP. Campers cannot attend Camp with a positive fecal. If positive, camper must be treated and a negative fecal must be achieved before attending Camp.
